

Donald P. Gregg '51. Don Gregg served in the Army from 1945 to 1947 before attending Williams. He joined CIA and was assigned to Japan, Burma, Vietnam and Korea. In 1979, Gregg was seconded to the NSC staff at the White House. In August 1982, following his retirement from the CIA, he became national security advisor to Vice President George H. W. Bush. With Vice President Bush, Gregg traveled to 65 countries including Korea. From 1980 to 1988, Gregg was also a professorial lecturer at Georgetown University, where he taught a graduate-level workshop entitled "Force and Diplomacy". From September 1989 to 1993, Gregg served as the U.S. Ambassador to Korea. He then headed The Korea Society for 15 years.
