

Fakhruddin Ahmed, CDE '71. Fakhruddin Ahmed served as Head of Government (with the title Chief Advisor) for the non-party interim government in Bangladesh from 2007 to 2009. He held various economic posts during fifteen years in the Bangladesh Civil Service, earning a PhD from Princeton along the way. He then spent twenty years at the World Bank, focusing on both macro and sector policy issues in South and East Asia and Africa. As Governor of the Bangladesh Bank (2001-05), he introduced wide-ranging reforms in both monetary and exchange rate policy and major reforms in the financial sector, including new financial markets and instruments and improved corporate governance. In 2005-7 he was Managing Director of PKSF, which provided finance and technical assistance to more than 200 micro-finance organizations in Bangladesh.
